## Maxwell Brook Culverts on Furbush Rd, Sabattus



## Project Highlights

- \$385,000 emergency repair project
- Awarded to St. Laurent & Son, Inc. of Lewiston, ME
- Work includes replacing three six-foot diameter culverts
- Road will remain closed until project is completed
- Detour route signed during road closure
- Projected completion is late August 2023

This project includes emergency repairs to the Maxwell Brook culverts on Furbush Road 300 feet west of the Turnpike in the Town of Sabattus.

All three pipes, installed in 1955, have rusted through at the waterline and have begun to collapse on themselves and created a 12-foot diameter sinkhole on Furbush Road.

The work includes pavement removal, excavation and backfill, temporary cofferdams and dewatering, temporary culvert installation, culvert removal and replacement, guardrail removal and reset and paving.

The road will remain closed until the project is completed (tentatively late August). A detour route is signed and will remain in place until the work is finished.

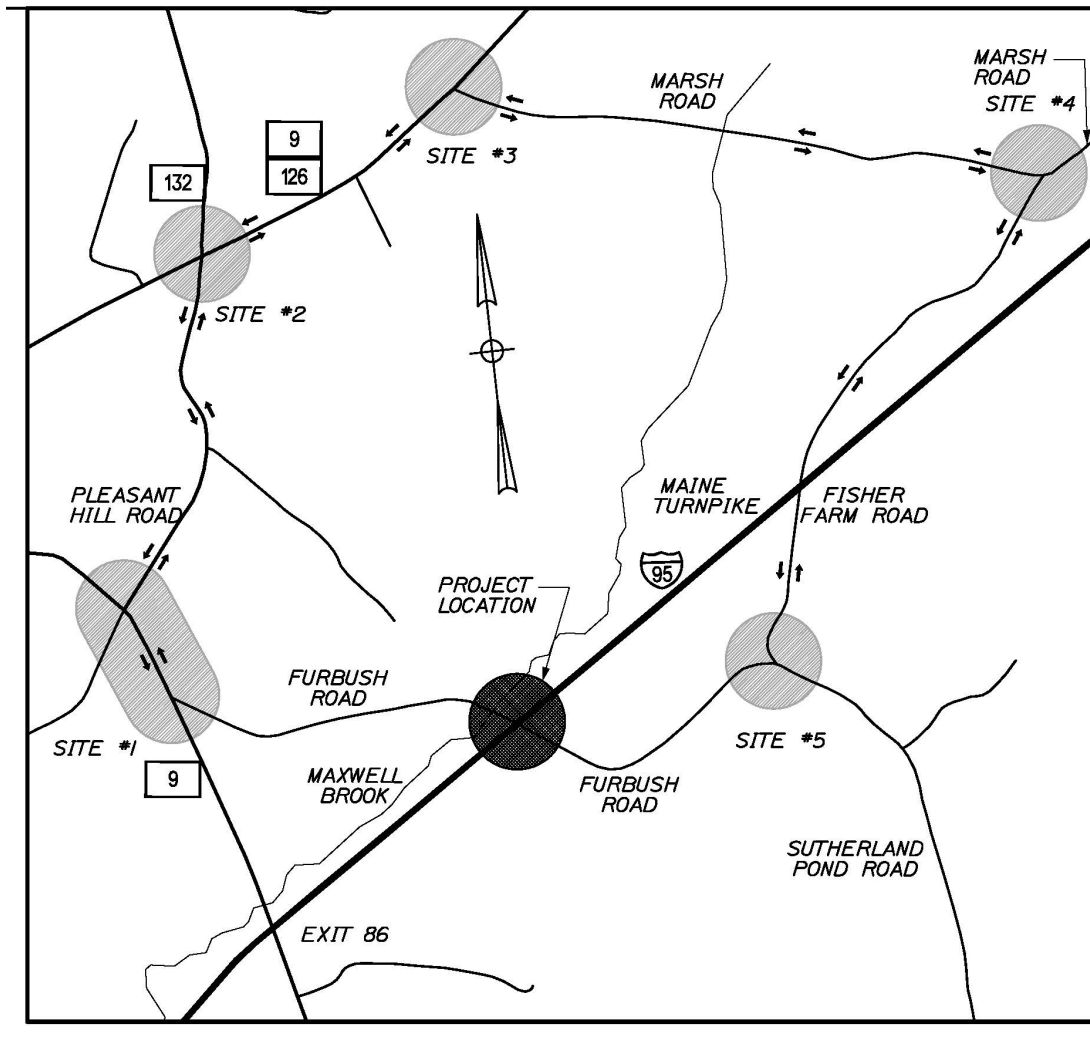

## Furbush Road Detour Route



Approximately 1,022 vehicles travel over the mainline of the Maine Turnpike on Furbush Road daily. Traffic is being routed around the construction site via a detour using Fisher Farm Road, Marsh Road, Route 126/9 and Pleasant Hill Road. The detour as signed is approximately 5.3 miles from one side of the bridge to the other.
