



Lisbon Road Bridge Project



Project Overview

The Lisbon Road Bridge was built in 1954 and the last major rehabilitation was in 1996. The work for 2014 on the bridge consists of adding a new bridge wearing surface, deck repairs and concrete repairs to the substructure. Lisbon Road Bridge will be closed during the completion of the repairs. Any necessary lane closures on the main line of the turnpike will be limited to off-peak times.

Project Schedule

April 2014

- Project out to bid
- Contract awarded to Scott Construction

September 2014


- Contractor mobilizing

End of September 2014

- Bridge to close for construction

October 2014

- Bridge reopens to traffic



Current Status

The contractor will begin mobilizing during mid to late September to install construction signage. Once the bridge is closed, the existing pavement will be removed, followed by repairs to the existing concrete deck. At which point, new pavement will be placed. Other work will include repairs to the concrete bridge abutments and piers, as well as replacement of the bridge joint seals.


Bridge Closure

In order to facilitate major construction activities and to ensure safety of the construction crews and public, the Maine Turnpike Authority plans to close the bridge for approximately three weeks beginning in late September. *(See back page for details)*



Detour Route

The Lisbon Road Bridge carries approximately 1,500 vehicles per day over the mainline of the Maine Turnpike. The signed detour route during bridge rehabilitation will redirect traffic to Jordan Bridge Road, to Middle Road and to Crowley Road. The detour as signed is approximately 7 miles.
