Small Road Bridge, Litchfield



Project Highlights

- Replacement of bridge superstructure
- Raising height of bridge to provide 15'6" clearance
- Bridge to be closed during construction
- Construction from June 2016 to November 2016
- \$1.8 million project

This project consists of replacing the Small Road bridge superstructure over the Maine Turnpike at Mile 95 in the Town of Litchfield. The rehabilitation of the bridge includes replacement and raising of the existing bridge structure to provide a minimum vertical clearance of 15'6", and repair of the existing abutments and piers. It also includes reconstruction of approximately 600 feet of the bridge approaches to match the raised bridge structure. The bridge will be closed to traffic for approximately 6 months during the construction of the improvements.


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Small Road Bridge Detour Route



The Small Road Bridge carries approximately 390 vehicles per day over the mainline of the Maine Turnpike. Traffic will be routed around the site via a detour using Plains Road, Richmond Road and Hallowell Road. The detour as signed is approximately 5.6 miles long.
