at the office of the Maine Turnpike Authority, 2360 Congress Street, Portland, Maine, until 11:00 a.m., prevailing time as determined by the Authority on February 13, 2015 at which time and place the Proposals will be publicly opened and read. Bids will be accepted from Contractors prequalified by the Maine Department of Transportation for Paving Construction Projects. All other bids may be rejected. This Project includes a wage determination developed by the State of Maine Department of Labor.

The pavement rehabilitation work consists of milling and resurfacing the two 12-foot wide lanes and the median shoulder in Locations 1 and 2 from mile 51.2 to mile 54.5. The pavement rehabilitation work consists of milling and resurfacing the two 12-foot wide lanes on the Falmouth Spur at the limits listed below and as shown on the Plans. The work also involves earthwork, bridge repairs, drainage, guardrail, berm dropoff correction, berm correction, pavement markings, maintenance of traffic and all other work incidental thereto in accordance with the Plans and Specifications in Locations 1 through 9.

The General Limits of work are as follows:

Location 1: Milling and Paving of northbound travel lanes from Mile 51.2 (Sta. 2552+51.92) in the City of Portland and extending northerly to Mile 54.5 (Sta. 2726+75.89) in the Town of Falmouth;

Location 2: Milling and Paving of southbound travel lanes from Mile 54.5 (Sta. 2726+75.89) in the Town of Falmouth and extending southerly to Mile 51.2 (Sta. 2552+51.92) in the City of Portland.

Location 3: Milling and Paving of eastbound travel lanes on the Falmouth Spur from the Exit 52 north bound off ramp in the Town of Falmouth and extending easterly to Station 199+60 in the Town of Falmouth;

- Location 4: Milling and Paving of westbound travel lanes on the Falmouth Spur (Sta. 199+60) in the Town of Falmouth and extending westerly to (Sta. 25+00) in the Town of Falmouth.
- Location 5: Clear zone and drainage work of northbound travel lanes from Mile 51.1 (Sta. 2551+50) in the City of Portland and extending northerly to Mile 55.0 (Sta. 2748+00) in the Town of Falmouth;
- Location 6: Clear zone, earthwork and drainage work of southbound travel lanes from Mile 55.0 (Sta. 2748+00) in the Town of Falmouth and extending southerly to Mile 51.2 (Sta. 2552+51.92) in the City of Portland.
- Location 7: Clear zone and drainage work of eastbound travel lanes on the Falmouth Spur from Exit 52 north bound off ramp in the Town of Falmouth and extending easterly to Station 199+60 in the Town of Falmouth.
- Location 8: Clear zone and drainage work of westbound travel lanes on the Falmouth Spur (Station 199+60) in the Town of Falmouth and extending westerly to (Sta. 25+00) in the Town of Falmouth.
- Location 9: Route 9 bridge work on the Falmouth Spur (MM 3.7) in the Town of Falmouth.

Plans and Contract Documents may be examined by prospective Bidders weekdays between 8:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. at the office of the Maine Turnpike Authority, 2360 Congress Street, Portland, Maine. The Plans and Contract Documents may be obtained from the Authority upon payment of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) for each set, which payment will not be returned. Bidders shall not contact any other Authority staff or Consultants for clarification of Contract provisions, and the Authority will not be responsible for any interpretations so obtained.

All work shall be governed by the Specifications entitled "State of Maine, Department of Transportation, Standard Specifications, Revision of December 2002", price \$13, (\$16 by mail) "Standard Details, Revision of December 2002" and "Best Management Practices for Erosion and Sediment Control", latest issue. Proposals must be accompanied by an original bid bond, certified or cashier's check payable to the Maine Turnpike Authority in an amount not less than Five (5%) Percent of the Total Amount in the Proposal, but not less than \$500.00. The Bidder to whom a Contract is awarded

will be required to furnish a Surety Corporation Bond, satisfactory to the Authority, on the standard Contract Bond form of the Authority, for a sum not less than the Total Amount of the Proposal.

Proposals must be made upon the Proposal Forms furnished by the Authority separately with the Contract Documents, and must be enclosed in the sealed special addressed envelope provided therefore bearing the name and address of the Bidder, the name of the Contract, and the date and time of Proposal opening on the outside.

A pre-bid conference will be held on February 3, 2015 at 11:00 a.m. at the Maine Turnpike Authority, 2360 Congress Street, Portland, Maine.

The Authority reserves the unqualified right to reject any or all Proposals and to accept that Proposal which in its sole judgment will under all circumstances serves its best interest.
